Restoration Projects Assistant

Position Objective: Assist CRC's restoration staff in NH, VT and MA to develop and implement restoration projects.

Position Period: Now thru June 30, 2022 (with additional time possible pending grant funding).

General Description

This part-time temporary position will support CRC staff with outreach to landowners, development of potential projects, and the implementation of on the ground river restoration projects. Work from home and/or out of CRC's Brattleboro, VT office location. Personal vehicle and internet access required. Travel (day trips) required.

Detailed Tasks to be Performed:

Assist the restoration program manager and other CRC staff with:

- Landowner outreach;
- Coordination with federal and state agency partners;
- Project development, assist with grant and permit writing, and site visits;
- Tree planting and on the ground work; and
- Identifying and implementing stream and river restoration projects, which might include dam removals, floodplain restoration, riparian buffer restoration, and habitat enhancement projects.

Requirements:

- Attention to detail, computer and software knowledge/experience;
- Interest in river ecology and stewardship;
- Ability to work in the field;
- Good communication (both oral and written) skills;
- Self-motivated, show up on time, keep track of multiple tasks;
- Flexible schedule – work may include weekday, evening, and weekend times; and
- A valid driver's license and a dependable vehicle.

Compensation: \$20/hour. Reimbursement for miles traveled in the course of job duties at current Federal rates.

Work Schedule: Variable - Expected time commitment: ~10 to 20 hrs./week.
